From The Pastor

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness— on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest" - Isaiah 9:2-3

Dear Friends,

As some of you were setting up for our annual Bazaar, in a pile of papers bound for the recycling bin someone had placed a "Liturgical Year" colored calendar. It got me to thinking about the ways we mark the different church seasons throughout the year. It was, more than anything else, a good reminder to explore the history and traditions around color, season changes, and culture of worship in our church experience. Although as I write this it is only the last week of October, Christmas planning is already underway, which means I and many others here at church are thinking about and planning the seasons of Advent and Epiphany. These are times of the year where white and yellow and gold are seen in symbols surrounding us. Candles and stars, a glowing manger, a gift of gold from a wise person: light colors are used to illuminate the important parts of the stories we hear. We are not alone in our focus, many other traditions use this time of year to bring a focus on "light". Our Jewish brothers and sisters celebrate Hanukkah, a celebration of light. Pagans honor the solstice, the darkest night, and a calling back of the light. Buddhists celebrate Bodhi Day or, the day of Enlightenment. During Diwali, Hindus light fireworks to honor the defeat of light over dark.

We're not alone in our search for light. Isaiah reminds us that light will shine on the darkness. It will be illuminated and we will see that which has been hiding. As we enter a new calendar year we are given an opportunity to look at ourselves and bring some light to our lives. It is an opportunity for deep reflection. While many people make New Year's Resolutions, perhaps we can call it New Year's Illumination. What parts of ourselves have we been placing in the shadows? What experiences, gifts, or yearnings have we been ignoring or downplaying? How can we illuminate the shadowy parts of our lives and honor them?

This is the gift of the seasons of Advent and Epiphany. Welcome the light. Allow it to change you.

May the coming seasons be a seasons filled with unexpected blessings and light, Pastor Liz

Stewardship

As you may have heard in recent services, November is Stewardship Month at First Congregational Church. This is a time to focus on how we use the gifts we've been given to provide support to our congregation.

The first thing I want to say here is Thank You!! Last year, we brought to the Congregation the news that our budget for previous years did not support a full-time pastor without borrowing from our endowment at an unsustainable rate. Pastor Liz suggested she move to part time to bring the budget into balance. We also asked the Congregation to consider increasing their giving if they were able. The result was a 17% increase in pledged income and a budget that would allow us to pay back a third of the previous year's borrowing from the endowment fund. As of the end of October, we are right on target with our giving to fulfill the budget. So, thank you all so very much for your commitments and continuing support.

So, what do we have to look forward to now? Have we accomplished all of our goals? Well, not really. If you look at the financials in our weekly bulletins, you'll find that our total giving is greater than our pledged income. This is great but is also expected-we budget assuming that more money will be given than pledged, as that is the norm for our Congregation. As noted above, overall, we are right on budget. At this rate, we will also pay back the endowment in two more years for the money we took out in 2024. Could we do more? There are signs that we could. Our church attendance and church family are growing this year, indicating there may be more people taking active roles in our Congregation. Additionally, this may be a year when some of our families have found their means increasing. God continues to show us love and care in many ways, including in this Congregation.

As I've stated before, I don't know what anyone in the church gives to the church. That is between you and God, but I encourage you to consider the ideas Pastor Liz is presenting this month and, as we approach November 23 rd, make a pledge of support to this Congregation to continue the work we do. And again, Thank you!

Ministry Report

I read a joke that said that the months of June, July, and August are like the "el-em-en-o- pee" of summer! I'm not sure what you we would call the months of October, November, and December, but they are ones that generally have more events on the calendar! Here is some of what is on our church calendar.

The Stewardship Campaign will follow Sanctified Art materials in a series entitled "Our Money Story." We will offer Communion Oct. 26, with part one of the series (and will not serve it on Nov. 2). When we finish the stewardship series on Nov. 23, we will again have Communion.

The Hanging of the Greens will be on Nov. 23. It takes about an hour after church, and the more hands helping, the better. There are helpful things that the children can do as well.

Advent begins on Nov. 30. On the 28th, we will celebrate the birth of Jesus with a Christmas carol sing during worship. Our theme will be "What do you fear?" . An Advent Devotional booklet (or e-book) will be available for free (or \$5.00 donation to offset printing). The Advent season comes to a close when we celebrate Epiphany on January 4. That is when we will receive our Star Words for the new year.

Finally, we wish to reiterate how grateful we are that many in our congregation have volunteered to fill the pulpit on the second Sunday of the month during 2024, since Pastor Liz transitioned to a part time position with us. 
Craft Group Update
