From The Pastor

Dear Friends,

The season of Advent is upon us! Advent is a holy time of preparation and anticipation. We wait for the Son of God along with all of creation. We wait for the baby along with expectant Mary. During Advent we prepare, and then throughout Christmastide we celebrate!

This season our worship will be based around the question of how does a weary world rejoice? The overall theme of this series points us to remember that we are worthy of joy. That our joy is rooted in our belonging to God. And that the world needs our joy, even if we and the world are weary. The team at sanctified art has said this about the worship series this year. "This advent, we will hold space for our weariness and our joy. We will seek a "thrill of hope' in our hurting world. We will welcome joy-- even and especially if, like the prophet Isaiah, we cry out for comfort (Isiah 40:1) In this weary world, may we find many ways to rejoice.

The church sanctuary is once again decked out with brightly lit greens, trees, and wreaths. The ceramic shepherds, angels, animals, wise men, and holy couple are gathered around the empty manger right down front where they belong all in anticipation of the baby's birth. The advent candles will be lit to remind us to prepare in our own special ways. This truly is a wonder-filled season in so many ways!

We are truly blessed with a wonderful staff that keep this congregation and this church moving ever forward. Our custodian, Doug Savela, does an amazing job keeping this church well prepared and looking good inside and out. Deb Sorenson, our Administrative Secretary, ensures the bills are paid, the letters get mailed, and the Sunday bulletins are printed. Joe Strouse streams our Sunday services on the internet to keep all our friends and family in touch even if they can't be here in person on Sunday morning. Jerry Stege provides the special music that makes our worship services so meaningful. And last, but certainly not least, Pastor Liz Hoy is our spiritual leader providing guidance we need to live more fulfilling lives. Now is the time for us to make a special donation so they all know how much we appreciate them and their work. Please give your check or cash to me, Elana Warsen, Abbie Huizenga, or Ron Sluis anytime before Sunday December 17th and we will ensure each member of the staff gets a special gift for this Christmas season.

We should also take time this holiday season to reflect and remember all the good stuff that happened for this congregation in 2023. We were able to provide Pastor Liz with a paid sabbatical enabling her to refresh, recreate, and renew her ability to serve as our spiritual leader. We were so fortunate to have Jane Lippert and Chris Lane fill our Sunday pulpit during the sabbatical period. Their messages filled us with the spirit to reach out and do more for our community. We had very successful fund-raising events that featured a book and boardgame sale, the annual Makers' Market, and the ever-popular Holiday Bazaar. thanks to dedicated leaders supported by many volunteers. This congregation is reaching out to become more engaged with the local community. Our monthly mission works have benefited many organizations that provide help to less fortunate folks. We are providing safe, secure venues for meetings of members of the LGBTQ+ community as well as helping to build trusted allies in keeping with our Open and Affirming certification. We are welcoming new members who see this as a place of worship that aligns well with their personal faith journey.

We also successfully replaced both our heating boilers with more energy efficient systems that should help us reduce our utility bills in 2024. The small boiler has been totally paid for, but we had to take out a \$60,000 loan to pay for the big boiler. We were able to negotiate a relatively low loan interest rate bringing the monthly payment down to \$330. Please consider writing a separate check to cover one of these payments if you find an extra \$330 in your bank account some month in 2024! Of course, if any of you find an extra \$60,000 lying around, we sure would appreciate your help in paying off this loan in full in advance!

It is my prayer for all of you reading this that you have a safe and happy Holiday season. I know I am looking forward to all that this season brings coupled with the words of HOPE, JOY, LOVE, and PEACE for all...and ALL means ALL!
